Command Center: SAR National Freq. 149.080 VHF FM
Registration - Information Desk located in Lou Soppit Community Center 4733 47 Street.

General Information:

- In case of emergency call 911, then notify the Command Center.
- In case of major emergency or disaster the muster point will be the community center and will be the rally location for all attendees.
- Report any problems or concerns to the Command Center immediately.
- Access codes for WiFi will be posted in the classrooms and the information desk.
- All venue and schedules changes will be posted on conference information screens, located in the community Center and the Arena.
- Photos will be taken during the conference and may be used for public notices and social media sites.
- SAR conference ID will be worn at all times to participate in all classrooms and venues. ID required for all meals.
- Shuttle bus provided for transportation to the airport and outdoor venues. Located at the Sports and Wellness Center for pickup and drop off.

Food and Beverage:

- All food and beverage will be served in the **Christenson Sports & Wellness Centre 5332 50th street. Lunch served 2nd floor and please have lunch with vendors.**
- Breakfast will not be provided
- Coffee, tea, juice, water and snacks during classroom breaks.
- Lunches served in the Sports and Wellness Center.
- There is a Subway, Tim Hortons, Domino's Pizza, Harveys all within walking distance to the conference site.

Parking and Staging:

- Curling Club parking for Vendors and Exhibitors.

Additional Information:
